After High School: Know Your Choices

Tami Palmer, Deputy Director of WOIS: The Career Information System will speak at the [Mountain View Timberland Library](#) on Wednesday, November 3 from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. She will share her knowledge and expertise in navigating the choices for post-high school education.

Ms Palmer will discuss up-to-date resources and websites for applying for schools, financial aid and scholarships. This program is mainly for parents but teens are also welcome. The library's program will follow up on Palmer's visit earlier in the day to White Pass Junior Senior High School where she will be speaking with students.

WOIS is a nonprofit organization that provides information about occupations, education programs and Washington schools, as well as colleges, universities and vocational schools nationwide. The Timberland Regional Library District subscribes to WOIS in order to provide the public in its five counties with free access to the resource.

WOIS is available at Timberland library computers or outside the library from home computers with Internet access by logging in with a "site key."
