Naselle library launches new gaming system

The Friends of the [Naselle Timberland Library](#) have purchased a new “Kinect for Xbox 360” video gaming system for the library, thanks to a grant from WellSpring Community Network. Join in a launch party at the library and try out the new Kinect on Friday, May 20 from 4 to 8 p.m. Refreshments will be provided by the Friends of the Naselle Timberland Library.

Kinect responds to the motions and voices of players without the need for a controller. The library’s system will be available for children, teens, and families to use in the meeting room anytime the library is open and the meeting room is available. People may drop by or make a reservation for a time during open hours to use the system.

Some of the games available are Kinect Adventures, Kinect Joy Ride, and Kinect Sports, with more to be added over time. Kids and families may also bring their own games with ratings EC (Early Childhood), E (Everyone), E10+ (Everyone 10 and older), or T (Teen).
