Spend an evening with Eleanor Roosevelt at North Mason library as portrayed by Northwest actor Debbie Dimitre

Join Northwest actress Debbie Dimitre at the [North Mason Timberland Library](#) for her portrayal of Eleanor Roosevelt on Thursday, March 10 at 7 p.m. This special event, free to the public, will interest both students of American history and those who appreciate its interpretation on the stage. There will be a brief business meeting of the Friends of the North Mason Timberland Library prior to the presentation, which is sponsored by the Friends group.

Eleanor Roosevelt was First Lady of the United States for twelve years, from March 1933 to April 1945. Active during and after her time in the White House, Mrs. Roosevelt was also a humanitarian, a writer and a delegate to the United Nations. In character and in costume as the courageous crusader for human rights, Ms. Dimitre will share portions of Roosevelt's life, triumphs, and struggles.

For over 20 years Dimitre has performed multiple times for numerous organizations, libraries, schools and other groups as well as Seattle's Northwest Folklife and other festivals. Her dramatic presentations bring to life the courage and accomplishments of women in history. In addition to Eleanor Roosevelt, Dimitre has portrayed Rachel Carson, Molly Pitcher, Annie Oakley, Harriet Beecher Stowe and Anne Morrow Lindbergh.
