

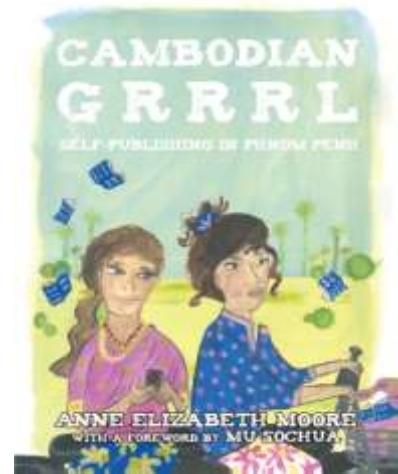

She is the founding editor of the Best American Comics series from Houghton Mifflin and the Comics Journal Special Edition anthologies from Fantagraphics Books. Her work with young women in Southeast Asia has been featured in various media sources including NPR’s Worldview with Jerome McDonnell.
