Catch a free screening of “KLUTE” Discussion with local filmmaker Dylan Sharp follows

“KLUTE,” a film produced as a collaborative project by several Olympia artists, will be screened at the Olympia Timberland Library on Wednesday, March 30 at 7:30 p.m. The film was shot on video between 2006 and 2010. Filmmaker Dylan Sharp will take questions after the screening. The library closes at 7 p.m. and will then be open only for the presentation. The program is for adults. It’s free of charge.



From Sharp’s synopsis:

Very loosely based on the film of the same name with actors Donald Sutherland and Jane Fonda, KLUTE tells the story of a single minded detective's efforts to discover the meaning behind a mysterious box of fake drugs. Sure of nothing other than his own identity and his ability to ask questions, John Klute becomes increasingly baffled by the complex world of human relationships into which he is thrust by his single minded commitment to law and duty...

Ultimately, Klute must confront the fact that the world which he inhabits is not contingent on him, and that the case he is involved in is much bigger than he can possibly solve. KLUTE is a comedic journey through neurotic subjectivity and narrative tropes.
