Grupo Quetzalcoatl de Olympia will perform at the Olympia Timberland Library after hours on Wednesday, November 10 from 7:30 to 8:45 p.m. Energy, drama, colorful costuming and the beat of drums characterize the group's performances. The program will include opening and closing circles; a demonstration of signature steps and a mixed selection of dances followed by a question and answer period.

Grupo Quetzalcoatl de Olympia takes in 50,000 years of historical and cultural Aztec tradition, from ancient forests to the urban jungle of Mexico City. The meanings of the dances vary, but all express respect for all life and celebration and respect for nature and her elements: earth, water, fire and wind.
