2013 Action Plan

Services, Programs & Outreach:

- Provide outreach to the Early Learning Center and local schools to ensure their connection to the library and support literacy skills and habits.
- Continue programming for children of all ages including monthly after school crafts, story times, and family activities.
- Continue to offer classes on eBooks and computers.
- Maintain our community presence by attending and participating in community meetings and events.
- Continue to create displays to highlight specific themes or events that invite patrons to expand and explore new areas of interest.
- Increase programs and activities for teens.

Partnerships:

- Work with the Friends of the Library to increase their effectiveness as advocates for the library.
- Collaborate with the Pacific County Historical Society and Museum.

Accomplishments: January - June 2013:

Services, Programs, and Outreach:

- Visited schools in May to promote Summer Reading. Contacted Raymond Elementary for fall visits. Contact has been made for Early Learning Center.
- Offered 18 computer classes and 20 eBook classes.
- Created regular children's book displays and adult program displays.
- Signed on a new teen volunteer for Summer Reading Program.
- Presented historical records and research overview to Columbia Heritage Museum.



Partnerships:

- Friends of the Raymond Library - New members attended meetings. New members actively using their Facebook to promote library and trying to get more members. Friends Treasurer is taking active part in soliciting donations.
- Partnered with Grays Harbor College for Money Smart Week, Earth Day Money Smarts.
- Participated in Gray's Harbor College Annual Spring event.

Accomplishments: July – December 2013:

Services, Programs & Outreach

- Visited Raymond Elementary in October, reaching 274 students.
- Conducted after school crafts in November and December.
- Presented family programs monthly, weekly in July and part of August.
- Increased Adult programming to monthly offerings.
- Conducted 10 classes on various computer programs, including Excel, Publisher, and Genealogy as well as downloading e-books.
- Helped write by-laws and strategic Plans for Willapa Community Network.
- Elected treasurer of Teen Advocacy Coalition and helped pursue and obtain a Drug Free Community Grant for TAC.
- Attended Harvest Festival at the Grays Harbor Community College-Riverview campus.
- Assembled displays concerning diabetes, Native American History and art, canning and preserving food, and various holidays; brought adult program themes to downstairs displays.



Partnerships

- Promoted '100 years of Library Service' through the year, culminating in a celebration on September 13 and 14.
- Added a partnership with Willapa Valley Grange by providing informational programs at regular Grange functions and having a source for library programs.
